The SkillsUSA Championships provides an opportunity for members to prove their industry-readiness by testing their skills and ability to standards set and assessed by industry partners. These competitive events begin at the local level and allow students to advance to regional, state, and national levels for recognition. Through the SkillsUSA Championships, members are able to connect with professionals within the field and develop relationships for future employment and success.



As an integral part of curriculum, the industry-validated SkillsUSA Championships provide students with workplace experiences in 14 career clusters. Industry partners establish entry level competencies to measure proficiency in technical and employability skill development resulting in the technical standards for each competition. Partners evaluate the authentic assessments that create the competitions. Through the Championships members are able to connect with professionals in the field to develop relationships for future employment success.

2021 STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS PLAN

As an organization, SkillsUSA Massachusetts focuses on fulfilling the organization's mission while ensuring long-term success. In the 47-year history of SkillsUSA Massachusetts, last year brought the first cancellation of the State Leadership and Skills Conference.

To ensure future success of SkillsUSA Massachusetts and continue to provide members the incredible opportunity to showcase their skills in front of business and industry partners across the country, SkillsUSA Massachusetts is committed to hosting our flagship program, the SkillsUSA Massachusetts Championships this year.

SkillsUSA Massachusetts staff has collaborated with the CTE community and other organizations, consulted with legal counsel and reviewed safety and health guidelines set by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary & Secondary Through this process, SkillsUSA Massachusetts has committed to hosting the State Championships following two guiding principles:

FOLLOW SAFETY AND HEALTH GUIDELINES

ENSURE CONTEST INTEGRITY AND RIGOR

With restrictions created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year's State Leadership and Skills Conference will be held in a hybrid model with the SkillsUSA Championships contests being host in a variety of ways. SkillsUSA Massachusetts will utilize essentially two major formats and two lesser utilized for state competition and all District qualifying events will be virtual (on-line exams).

Framework Connection

The State Leadership and Skills Conference and State Championships is the pinnacle SkillsUSA Massachusetts program allowing student to showcase their skill development around the essential elements of the SkillsUSA Framework.

During the event, members will become aware, demonstrate and highlight their mastery around six essential elements:

Self-Motivation Remaining engaged & successful for the long-

Professionalism Creating a comfortable, respectful & safe culture

> **Decision Making** Determining best possible results

Planning, Organizing and Management Completing your work

Job-Specific Skills Effectively fulfilling all job functions

Safety and Health Contributing to a safe & healthy work environment

These essential elements will be realized during pre-work, event activities as well as post-event through programming that includes SkillsUSA Championships contests, training experiences, as well as special events. This event will also celebrate SkillsUSA Framework skill development though honoring Chapters of Excellence as well as students who have earned SkillsUSA Career Essentials credentials.

Displaying these skill sets allow students to showcase technical skills, connect students to employers, as well as develop employability skills that are validated by our business partners. The language around the SkillsUSA Framework allows members to articulate to employers their skills and how their time in SkillsUSA benefits employers.

CONTEST DELIVERY FORMAT

SkillsUSA Massachusetts will offer all 102 career competition contest in fourteen series of events this year. Additionally, through business and industry need and support, two new contests will be demonstrated this year. Delivery will look different than in year's past. Contests will be offered in two formats: Virtual Live (some with prior submissions) and In-person. There will also be a few that are 100% on-line exams and one Kahoot. (see list of contests on the next page for planned delivery methods). *This list subject to change.

VIRTUAL LIVE

Contestants will interact in real-time with judges. Facilitated using video conferencing platform (ZOOM) contestants will log in prior to their scheduled appointment time and will be placed a waiting room until their time.

ZOOM System Requirements: Computer, Tablet or Mobile Device with speakers & mic built-in or web cam and an internet connection – broadband wired/wireless/hot spot (3G or 4G/LTE). Minimum bandwidth is 600kbps (up/down) recommended is 1.5 Mbps (up/down). Check your Internet bandwidth using Speedtest (www.speedtest.net). ZOOM supported OS: Mac OS X with MacOS 10.7, Windows 10, 8 or 8.1, 7

IN-PERSON

Contestants will compete in-person on Friday, April 30, 2021 at Blackstone Valley RTHS (and two other sites) following all COVID-19 precautions.

Example: Contestants will arrive on site by 9:00 AM for a 10:00 AM competition start and all contests will end at 3:30 PM. A complete plan for entry/exit and in-contest COVID-19 precautions will be developed and communicated.

Breakfast & Lunch will be provided in contest areas. No observers will be allowed to view the competition in=person. Coverage will be provided at www.maskillsusa.tv



The goal of SkillsUSA Massachusetts is to provide local chapters with as much information as possible to be successful in preparing and engaging members into the experience of the SkillsUSA Championships. The timeline of events (right) outlines information availability deadlines and events.

On the next page is a list of contests and a preliminary format with which each contest will be presented. Specific technical standards for each contest that will outline how to prepare for the contest, equipment and technologies needed and any modifications to the technical standards will be available by February 1, 2021 or sooner.

DISTRICT COMPETITION (STATE QUALIFYING EVENTS)

District competitions will be held on the dates previously published for District events. The competition will be presented as online exams following the format of years past. All three exams (Trade, Empoyability & Safety) will be presented as one continuous on-line exam. Exam time will be 2.5 hours. Registered Chapters will receive links to the exams prior to their District date. Exam preparation guides for Employability & Safety Exams will be available January 2021.

STATE LEADERSHIP & SKILLS CONFERENCE

The 47th SkillsUSA Massachusetts State Leadership & Skills Conference will be held April 11 - May 1, 2021. The conference will kick off on April 11th with a virtual Opening Ceremony followed by a Championships Kick-off where contestants will be able to access their contest projects and information (for contests that will require virtual upload and ZOOM). Contestants will compete on a series of days over a three week period culminating with the in-person contests on Friday, April 30, 2021.



SkillsUSA Massachusetts will also have virtual experiences for members to take part in including development sessions, community engagement projects, delegate sessions and more.

On May 6, 2021 we will celebrate the work of our members and chapter with a virtual Awards Ceremony. Here, the gold, silver and bronze medalist for contest will be recognized and state officers elect and scholarship winners announced. The top competitor in each contest will represent Massachusetts at the National Leadership and Skills Conference.

NEW CAREER COMPETITIONS

Precision Laser Imgaing

Team of 2 | Manufacturing

Laser engraving systems are being used in advanced manufacturing programs, graphic design programs, and engineering programs. This competition will be a team of two (2). Student roles: The Design Team Member would need to use either Adobe Illustrate or CorelDraw and design the file. The Imaging Team Member who runs the laser would manipulate the files and cut the image.

The Design Team Member needs to do the creative design work, and the Imaging Team Member needs to take the file and laser engrave the image and laser cut the shape. Design Challenge:

§ Phase one: 1.5 hours – Machine orientation. The teams will be divided in half and work with each machine for 45 minutes to orient themselves to the machine. All teams will use each type of machine; one type for each phase.

\$ Phase two: 1.5 hours – Students will be provided one material to be used to produce a standard trophy or award.

§ Phase three: 1.5 hours – Students will be supplied a second material to be used to produce a base to hold the award.

Safety Poster Design

Teams of 2 | Freshman Events

This contest is open to active SkillsUSA members currently enrolled in the Freshman Exploratory. Exploratory may be completed before participating in the competition but contestant must still be in their Freshmen year of their CTE experience.

Performance: There is no written exam for this contest. Skill Performance: The contest requires the presentation of the completed safety poster designed specifically to educate incoming freshmen about workplace safety during exploratory.

A Safety poster must be designed and created prior to the competition by the two contestants only. The poster design will be submitted on-line and the actual poster must be present during the ZOOM presentation.
