

# "What's in Your Backpack?" the game show

## Objective:

School teams will compete by using the school-related items packed in their backpacks to fulfill specific item requests from the game show host. The team that successfully meets the most requests wins!

## RULES:

- 1. Team Formation:**
  - Each school team will consist of **3-5 Career and Technical Education (CTE) educators**.
  - Each team will choose a team captain responsible for presenting backpack items.
  - Every team is allowed **one** backpack filled with school-related items.
- 2. Packing the Backpack:**
  - Teams must pack their backpack **before** the game begins.
  - Teams are allowed to build their Game Play Backpack with items brought from other school mate backpacks before the game starts.
  - Backpacks may contain **any school-related items** (e.g., markers, rulers, calculators, sticky notes, tape, small tools, etc.).
  - No changes can be made to the backpack contents once the game starts.
- 3. Game Rounds:**
  - The game show host will call out specific **item requests** (e.g., "I need something to measure with!" or "Find a yellow 2 pocket folder!").
  - Teams must **quickly search** their backpacks and present the requested item to the host.
  - The first team to produce an item that fits the request **earns a point** (or the host may award points based on creativity and usefulness).
- 4. Special Challenges/Tie breaker:**
  - Some rounds may include **"mystery challenges"** where teams must combine multiple items to solve a problem.
  - Example: "Build a quick stand for a tablet using only items in your backpack!"
- 5. Winning the Game:**
  - The team with the **most points** at the end of all rounds **wins** and receives a prize and bragging rights!

## Additional Rules:

- If multiple teams present an item at the same time, the host decides which one best meets the request.
- Items **must** come from the backpack—teams cannot borrow or use outside materials.

Creativity and thinking outside the box are **encouraged!**
